Stella's family is very tightly knit. Her mother, brother, and nephew live with Stella and her 11-year-old son, Gage. On top of being the household's sole provider, Stella also cares for her elderly mother.

Gage receives free meals at school, which helps offset the cost of food for their family. But even when school is in session, Gage regularly struggles with hunger at night, over the weekend, and during school breaks because there isn't enough food at home to go around.

A house of six is almost impossible to feed on only one income.
