## **BACKPACK PROGRAM**

66,178 Food 2 Kids Backpacks were provided weekly for eight months to over 2,814 hungry children on 42 school campuses

## **KIDS CAFE AND SUMMER FEEDING**

51,561 Kids Café meals and snacks were served five days a week at 14 sites – up to 959 children were served on a single day

## **SCHOOL PANTRIES**

17 school pantries were established on campuses across six counties and served 6002 children/families during the school year

## **FOOD 2 BABIES**

Referred WIC clients received baby formula and other baby items, as needed.

## DRIVE-THRU PANTRIES

- 10,688 families were served from the Odessa facility
- 7,373 families from our Midland facility

## SENIOR BOX PROGRAM

- 1,571 senior clients registered to receive supplemental food from the Senior Box program in collaboration with 12 partner agencies

## MOBILE OUTREACHES

- 14, 960 families served in 17 outreaches in the rural & underserved areas



1,408 HOUSEHOLDS HAVE RECEIVED APPROXIMATELY 73,216 POUNDS OF FOOD FROM THE PANTRY,  
OR MORE THAN 61,013 MEALS. 1,358 HOUSEHOLDS RECEIVED MORE 95,420 POUNDS OF  
FOOD, WHICH IS EQUIVALENT TO OVER 79,517 MEALS.
